- Research to address knowledge gaps on range of subjects including: health data, the potential offered XR technology and barriers to adoption and measuring social impact in conjunction with trade associations across the UK and Europe.

- Convened and organised stakeholder engagement events e.g. for the health and social care workforce to challenge boundaries, share learnings and explore innovative solutions.
